DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

BOLIVIA

BOLIVIA'S TRADE PARTNERS ARE BRAZIL, THE UNITED STATES, ARGENTINA, JAPAN, PERU, SOUTH KOREA, BELGIUM, CHINA AND VENEZUELA WHICH IS EXPANDING. HYDROCARBONS MAKES UP 45% OF THE EXPORTED FROM BOLIVIA. 27% OF THE GOODS TRANSPORTED ARE MANUFACTURED GOODS, 24% ARE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS AND 4% ARE MINERALS.
