He's smart enough to know better and good enough to never think of doing so. This is no light matter and I know he was falsely accused by the Ewell family. Tom Robinson was an innocent man put through a hell that no should have to go through.

Supposedly Tom was heading to work when Mayella Ewell invited him inside her house to fix a door for a nickel. When Tom got inside with Mayella he raped and beat her until her daddy found her later and called the police. This was the Ewell's side of the tale, but the way Mayella talked about her story made it hard to believe she was telling the truth with all that stutterin'. When Tom was finally called up to the stand, he pleaded against these accusations and told the truth about what happened. He spoke about how Mayella did invite him inside her house to fix a door.
