THIRTEEN REASONS WHY is a young-adult fiction novel written by Jay Asher. This book has an ironic 13 book awards. The most major one is the New York Times BestSeller and Publishers Weekly BestSeller. It's a big deal but as a reader chances are you could care less. Something exciting is THIRTEEN REASONS WHY is a developing movie. The director are casting famous actors for the lead rolls. You can follow Clay as he listens to the tapes. Hannah leaves behind a map showing all the major spots where the tapes take place. The map is scary at the same time because you see where everything goes down. Then imagination comes into view and you feel bad for Hannah because she went through a lot.

I recommend this book for kids ages 13+. It does have some graphic materials that might scare little kids. But it's a book of a lifetime. It's a mixture of everything. I little bit of romance. A pinch of horror, it had one or two funny moments and a mystery that has people asking. Why did Hannah Baker kill herself? What made her tick? It's very suspenseful, once you hear one tape you want to figure out who is on the next one, and why they're on it. I recommend it to anybody who likes all those
