PENNSYLVANIA IS HOME TO A STAGGERING AMOUNT OF GUN VIOLENCE

- From 2002 to 2011, 13,207 people were killed with guns in PA. (Twice the number of ALL U.S combat deaths in Iraq and Afghanistan war combined)
- Someone is killed in PA with a gun every 6 hours

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE RESULTS IN GUN CRIME

- According to the FBI, there were 591 domestic violence homicides in PA from 2003-2012, included both male and female victims.
 - Of those, more than half of the victims, **51.8%** were killed by guns.

A majority of Pennsylvanians support background checks required on all gun sales.



WHERE DO WE STAND?

PA has laws that protect women from stalker and misdemeanant domestic abuser prohibited BUT

There's NO law that protects women from an individual subject to a domestic violence protective order prohibited and NO law that protect people from purchasing a gun.

95% majority of Pennsylvanians support background checks required on all gun sales.
