GEORGE ORWELL ANIMAL FARM



Repeating words at the beginning of dialogue

What's this element?

What's the impact on the reader?

Sentence length

What's this element?

Why does it matter?

What's the impact on the reader?

The breaks in the middle of the sentences that are over twenty words cause the reader to stop and think about what they read and digest the content on the first half of the sentence before reading the second half of the sentence and make the connection between the halves. My emulation: Endless






Annotation #2
