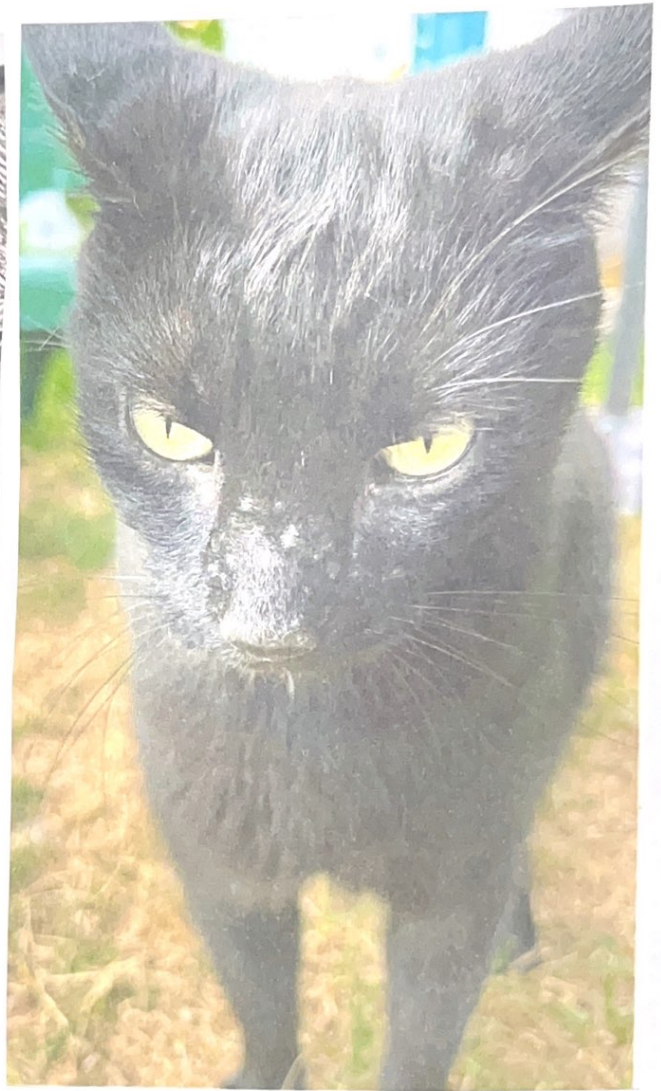

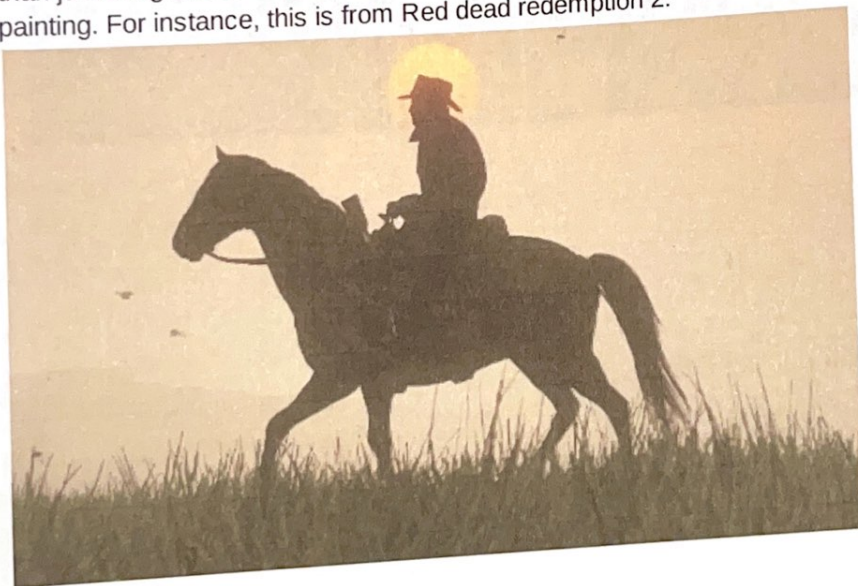

My Passion

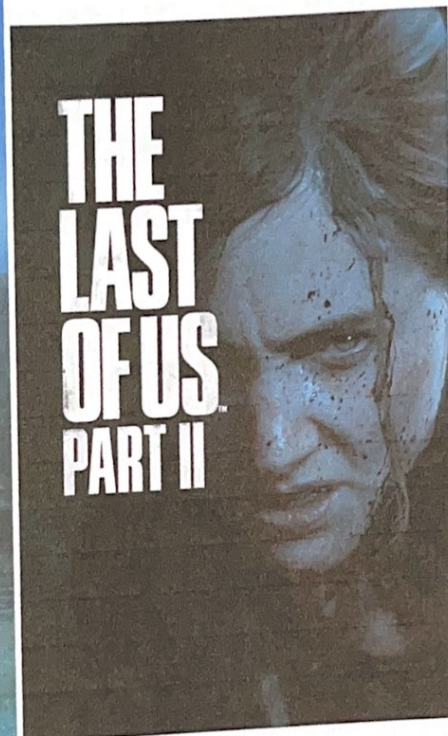
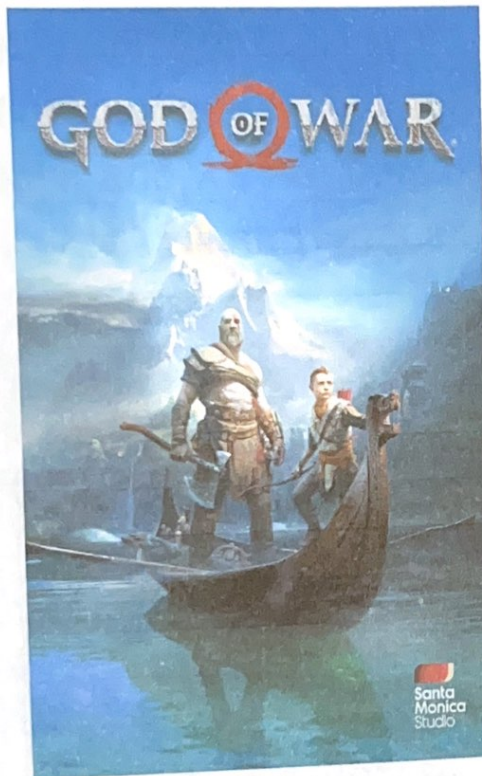

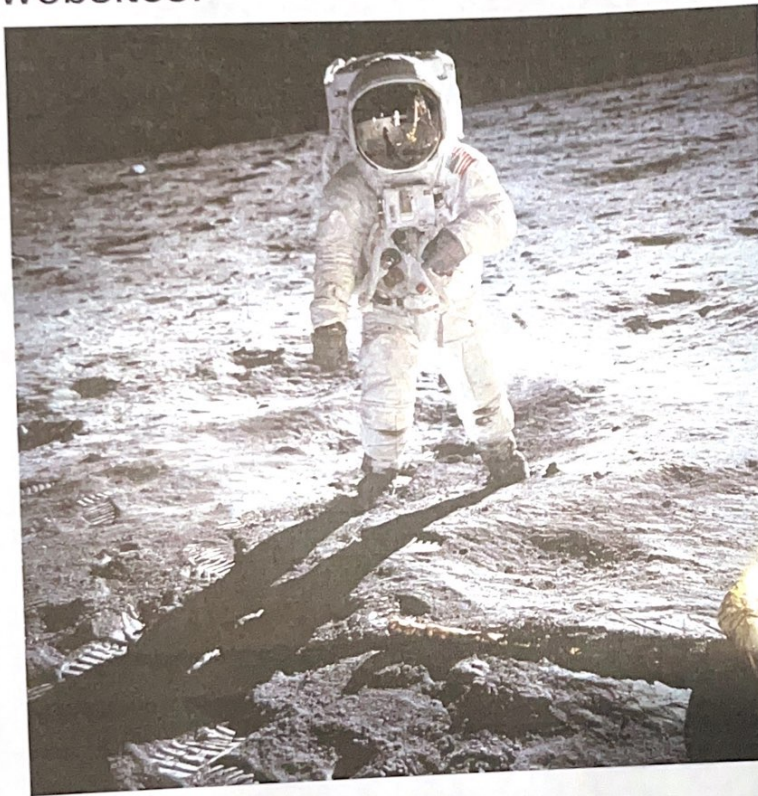
